WARKWORTH UKRAINE SUPPORT GROUP

I enclose some of the text of a letter written recently to our local MPs following a meeting of local Ukraine Support Groups under the auspices of the Northumberland County of Sanctuary.

We have asked for a meeting to discuss parliamentary thinking following the recent deepening developments in the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

"Our discussions ranged across the options that our Ukrainian guests, many who came three years ago under the homes for Ukraine Scheme, might have in the future, assuming that the war continues beyond the present visa continuation of 18 months granted by the government.

Many will not have homes to return to as a result of bombing, some will have no homes in Ukraine since theirs may well have been within regions now annexed by Russia and others may wish to claim asylum."

We also stated that such issues are not confined to our local guests but are important across the country for all those who have taken refuge under the Homes for Ukraine scheme.

We also stressed that now is the time to give continued support to our guests under such difficult times and the uncertainty of global politics.

So far we have heard from one local MP with a possible meeting in September- we hope to hear from more soon.

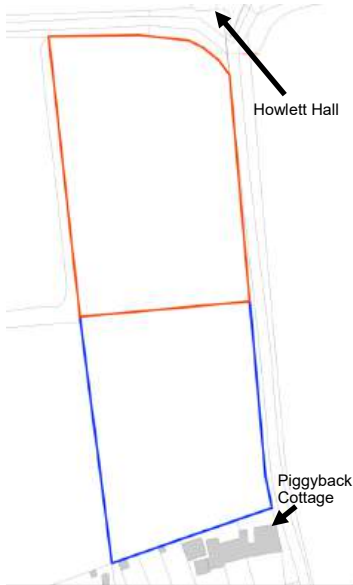

Warkworth Dog Walking Facility & Sensory Garden Planning Proposal

Residents at the Morwick Road end of the village recently found out about a new planning application to change the use of a wild meadow agricultural field into a secure dog walking facility and sensory garden for autistic children.



The Council on-line public access planning portal has all the relevant documents: the site of the proposal is the field running along the single track road from the back of 'Piggyback Cottage' on Watershaugh Road down to Howlett Hall. This field is currently agricultural land in an environmental stewardship programme that has been under-sown with wild flowers to promote wildlife.

The proposal aims to develop the downhill Northern half of the site, shown in red on their plan; however, the proposal asks for a change of use for the entire field, leaving the uphill Southern half empty, but no longer 'agricultural land'.

The Southern margin of this field runs along, and is outside, the 'Settlement Boundary' of the Warkworth Neighbourhood Plan and was not adopted by the plan as a Local Green Space as it was agricultural land.

Most people would probably agree with the need to develop sensory garden facilities for autistic children and there is a case for secure facilities for exercising nervous, reactive or aggressive dogs. The question is whether this is the best location and should it be at the expense of local environmental efforts?

A few residents had received letters of notification from the Council but only one public notice had been posted, taped in a plastic sleeve to a power post on private land. Concerned about a lack of public awareness the council were contacted and agreed to extend the coverage of notification and **the deadline for comments from July 15th to July 30th.**

After dinner speakers over the last month have included Julie Stephensen a long-standing Rotarian, who gave an entertaining talk about her involvement with Morpeth Rotary club.



June ended with a fund-raising Bingo and BBQ night at Warkworth Cricket Club with the aim of raising money for local student Aimee Davison's Student Minds appeal (a UK based Student mental health charity). The evening proved a remarkable success raising nearly £500 on the night from profits from the

BBQ, the Bingo and raffle. In addition, RAW members at a recent business agreed to also give a donation to bring the total raised to £600. 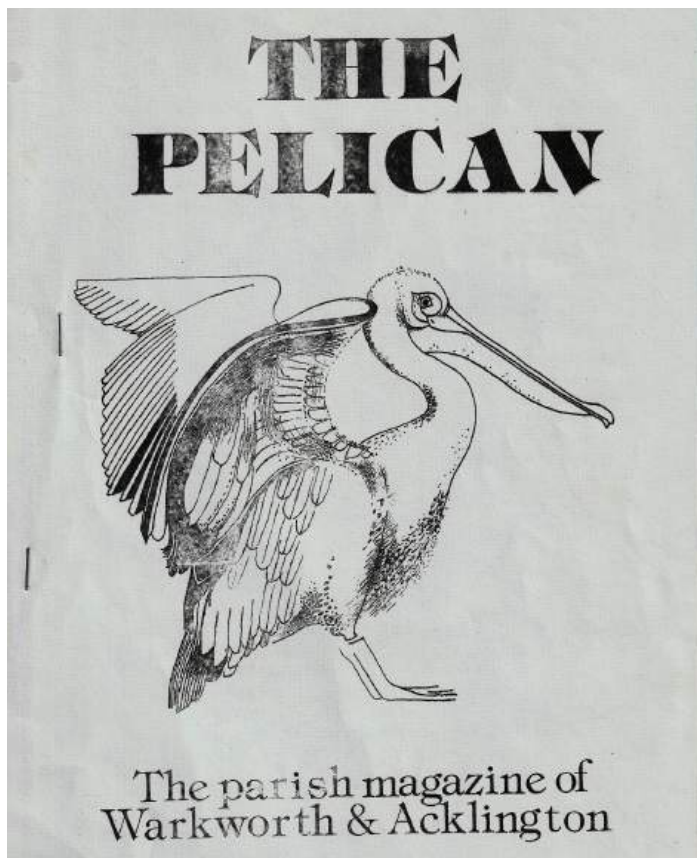

This month's bird of the month is the **Long-Tailed Tit**.

8 Facts About the Long-Tailed Tit

- Size- These birds measure about 13–15 cm, with their tail making up over half that length.
- Habitat - woodlands, gardens, hedgerows, heathland
- Social - and noisy in flocks
- They form active winter flocks of 6–20+ birds, constantly calling to one another.
- Diet - Insectivorous diet mostly insect eggs, larvae, spiders, (supplement with seeds or feeder treats in winter.)
- Nest – is elaborate domed camouflaged & woven over 2–3 weeks (moss, lichen, spider silk & lined with thousands of feathers, sometimes camouflaged with lichen bits.
- Breeding - Single annual brood and cooperative breeding lay one clutch of 6–11 eggs. Failed breeders will often help feed relatives at other nests.
- Lifespan- 2–3 years (occasionally reach 8–9 years.)
- Population- stable.

25TH October from 10am at Warkworth Memorial Hall

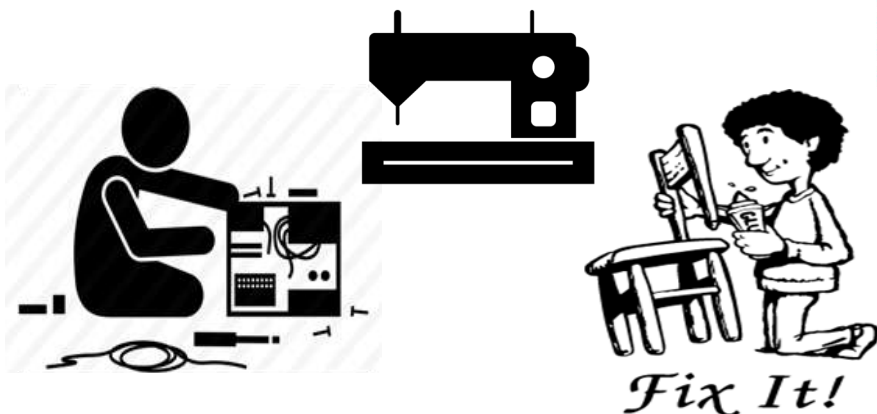

Saturday September 6th – Maria

A biographical, psychological drama starring Angelina Jolie as opera singer Maria Callas, following the seven days before her death in Paris in 1977, as she reflects on her life and career. Jolie delivers an impressive performance as Callas as she succumbs to illness and loneliness. Maria broods over her medication and neglects to eat, and she is impossibly difficult with the servants, housekeeper Bruna (Alba Rohrwacher) and valet Ferruccio (Pierfrancesco Favino), who are the witnesses to her decline – and she is beginning to question the idea that she will ever sing again. The story is interspersed with hallucinatory flashbacks to the days of her celebrity pomp, but also further back to her childhood in Greece. (2024 cert 12, 2h 3').

ACKLINGTON HISTORY SLOT - St Wilfrid's Brainshaugh



The ruins of St Wilfrid's Chapel near Brainshaugh are set in a sheltered bend of the river Coquet. Today little remains, it was originally part of a Premonstratensian nunnery of Gysnes (Guyzance). Founded in the early 12th century by Richard Tison.

Richard Tison was born in Alnwick his father was Gilbert de Teson and his mother was French Béatrix of Normandy. Tison in old French meaning 'a piece of wood' and 'firebrand' so often a person with a fiery temperament.

Early documents mention both the 'capella monialum' (monastery church) and the 'ecclesia de Gisyng' (church of Guyzance) so it is hard to say which the present ruin represents. It is thought to have been abandoned at the time of the Black Death and later given to the canons of the Abbey of Alnwick. It had fallen out of use by 1500.

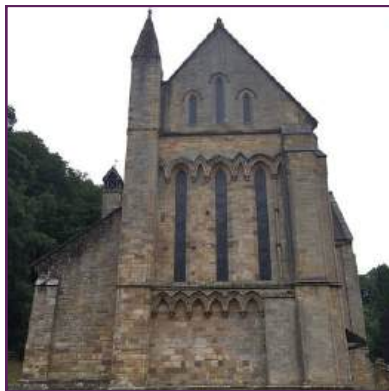
Today the chapel is still standing: what we see today are the nave and the side walls of the chancel. Parts of the chapel walls were incorporated into a post-medieval enclosure wall, built to enclose the grave yard and to protect the site from stone robbing.



The floor of the chapel has post-medieval flagstones and there is a 19th century grave slab at the western end. It was the burying place of the local Tate family. The remains of a fluted pillar and medieval grave cover can be seen outside the chapel. The uneven ground to the south of the chapel suggests that the foundations of other priory buildings are buried there. It was dissolved in 1539.

Secret passage

According to popular local tradition, there was a subterranean passage between Brainshaugh and Brinkburn. But it may actually have been a secret footpath through the dense wood, which in early times filled the vale of the Coquet.



More modern usage

It may be out of use now but in the 19th century services were held under a large thorn tree.

In the early 20th century an annual church parade of Northumbrian Cyclists was held promoted by the Vicar of Acklington, the Rev. Rudge, who took a keen interest in the event and attended regularly. The cavalcade of cyclists travelled from the vicarage in Acklington to Brainshaugh for an outdoor service before returning for refreshments at the vicarage.

Who was St Wilfrid?

The priory was named after a Northumbrian saint. Wilfrid was born in Northumbria and became a monk on the Island of Lindisfarne; he spent time in Canterbury, several years in France, was Abbot of Ripon, founded a monastery in Hexham, and became Bishop of York. He is thought to be the first native Englishman to make a pilgrimage to Rome.

County Councillor's Report

Hello. My name is Pauline Davidson; I am the new County Councillor for Amble West & Warkworth. My ward also includes Acklington, Guyzance, and many farms and small villages, all of which I visited during my campaign.

Many of you will know me already as I have lived in Acklington for several years. Those who do not know me, may have seen me being dragged around the village by my Husky dog, Zeus.

One of the first things I wanted to tackle, was speeding through our village. I don't think anyone living in Acklington would not be concerned by this. Many drivers ignore the 30MPH signs as well as the flashing sign. Speeds have been recorded up to 69MPH. A recent speed survey showed that 79% of vehicles speed when going through the village.

So, what happens now? I am looking into the possibility of installing speed cushions starting close to the crossroads at the east end of the village and ending just before the first traffic calming chicane. The cushions are manufactured from recycled rubber; they allow emergency vehicles to pass with ease and control the traffic to a speed of 30MPH. The money will come out of my County Council budget designated for my ward. The Highways department have kindly agreed to fit them for free. Let us hope it is sooner rather than later!

My other projects include:

- Southfield View, unfinished road surface and paths
- Provision of bus stops at Coal House Farm sanctioned (to be installed)
- Meeting with Director of Acklington Prison to agree signage for R.A.F memorial
